




EGG MY YARD





A BRIDGE TO SOMEWHERE UNIQUE

Another project that is a long time in coming will change the vista of the city of Humboldt and how it bisects the Des Moines River Valley in the community.

It also will provide a new recreational outlet for citizens. It also will provide a safe passage from the northern, central and eastern portions of Humboldt and Dakota City to the city's

southwest side without having to walk along or cross Highway 169.

The project is a pedestrian, single-span bridge across the Des Moines River, linking the existing Cottonwood Trail to Eagle Ridge where there will be a 2.2-mile granular trail around a heavily-wooded area to the northeast of Eagle Ridge Drive.

"Originally it was going to be two separate projects, then it was combined into one single project," Humboldt City Parks Superintendent Clayton Vorland explained.

When the Eagle Ridge Addition housing development was created in the late 2010s, city leaders wanted to have a set aside natural area off the development for future development as a park or public space. The city of Humboldt, Humboldt County Conservation and the Humboldt County Housing Development Corporation agreed to set aside land for such a public purpose, keeping the roughly 30-acre parcel as a green space area. The city, county and Humboldt County Housing each contributed \$30,000 to purchase the ground.

The city will be receiving Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) funds from the state and federal government, which will pay for nearly half of the \$2.4 million total project.

It started as a single-span bridge with no pier. However, after COVID and some design changes, a pier was added and the cost nearly doubled, from \$1.1 million to more than \$2 million. "The original design was also cost prohibitive," Bockelmann said.

"The biggest thing was getting some kind of connecting trail or bridge to the 30-acre piece in Lower Eagle Ridge," Vorland said. "The long-term goal for the county is to get connecting trails out to Sheldon Park.

"The reason I wanted to get the project done was so anyone could get from the high school to the central part of the city without having to cross the highway," Vorland added.

"Kids from the Elmhurst and Eagle Ridge area can get down to Heinz Field without having to cross the highway. People in the central part of town can get to the Rec Center and the schools."

Ideas for developing connecting trails/walking/biking bridges were outlined in the 2017 Humboldt Community Visioning design plan, part of ways to connect the central business district and Dakota City to the city's growth areas in the southwest part of town.

The city will be paying \$100,000 from the general fund and the county will be paying \$100,000, which it has set aside over a three-year period. The TAP Grant is \$950,000. The remaining approximately \$1.2 million in funds the city will be bonding for.

"It will basically have a net zero impact on property taxes for city residents because of debt being retired in 2024 that was used to pay for the construction of the north water tower. It could actually go down slightly," Bockelmann said.

The city council will be having a public hearing on the general bond issuance at its Feb. 5 meeting at 5:30 p.m. at Humboldt City

Hall. The city is seeking authorization of a loan agreement in the amount of not to exceed \$2,300,000 for essential corporate purposes. The notes, if approved, will be used to pay for the Eagle Ridge Nature Trail project.

The bridge itself will be steel guardrails and a prefabricated precast concrete structure that will be installed with a crane in sections.

There will be a fair amount of grading and some clearing for the paved connection trail from the end of the bridge to the start of the crushed limestone circular trail in Eagle Ridge.

There is already a pathway trail in the area so much of the work will be widening and flattening that out.

"The Iowa Department of Natural Resources feels pretty good about us getting the designation without any obstacles," Bockelmann said.

There have also been two archeological studies required because of the federal funding. One was due to a request from a Native American tribe and the other was to outline the habitat for species such as Spotted Bats and mussels.

"We want to maximize our green space and outdoor recreation opportunities and this project is going to set us apart from communities our size and hopefully set us apart as a community where people want to live and recreate and others may want to visit because of the amenities we offer. I think we are all working toward the same goal of maximizing the river as an amenity," Bockelmann said.

"The Humboldt City Council sees a benefit with the purchase of the Linhares property and the county does as well with the work that's being done at Sheldon Park and discussion of dam and river improvements in the community," Bockelmann said.

"Getting that project paid for with nearly 80 percent outside funding was a no-brainer when you look at the development in the Eagle Ridge area. They just keep building houses and more development is available to the south.

"There is lots of wildlife there — turkeys, deer, red fox. It will be an exciting project. Once people visit it, they will love it. Most people haven't seen it," Lee said.

"We (County Conservation) will be happy to see it become a reality," he added.

"It matches the vision of Humboldt County in making it a strong outdoor recreation community," the city administrator said.

"We've seen time and time again after COVID, especially with incentives from the state and the feds emphasizing quality of life and outdoor recreation, and this is an enhancement on that," Bockelmann said.
